Ellie went on to compete in three more Paralympic Games, winning a further three gold medals.

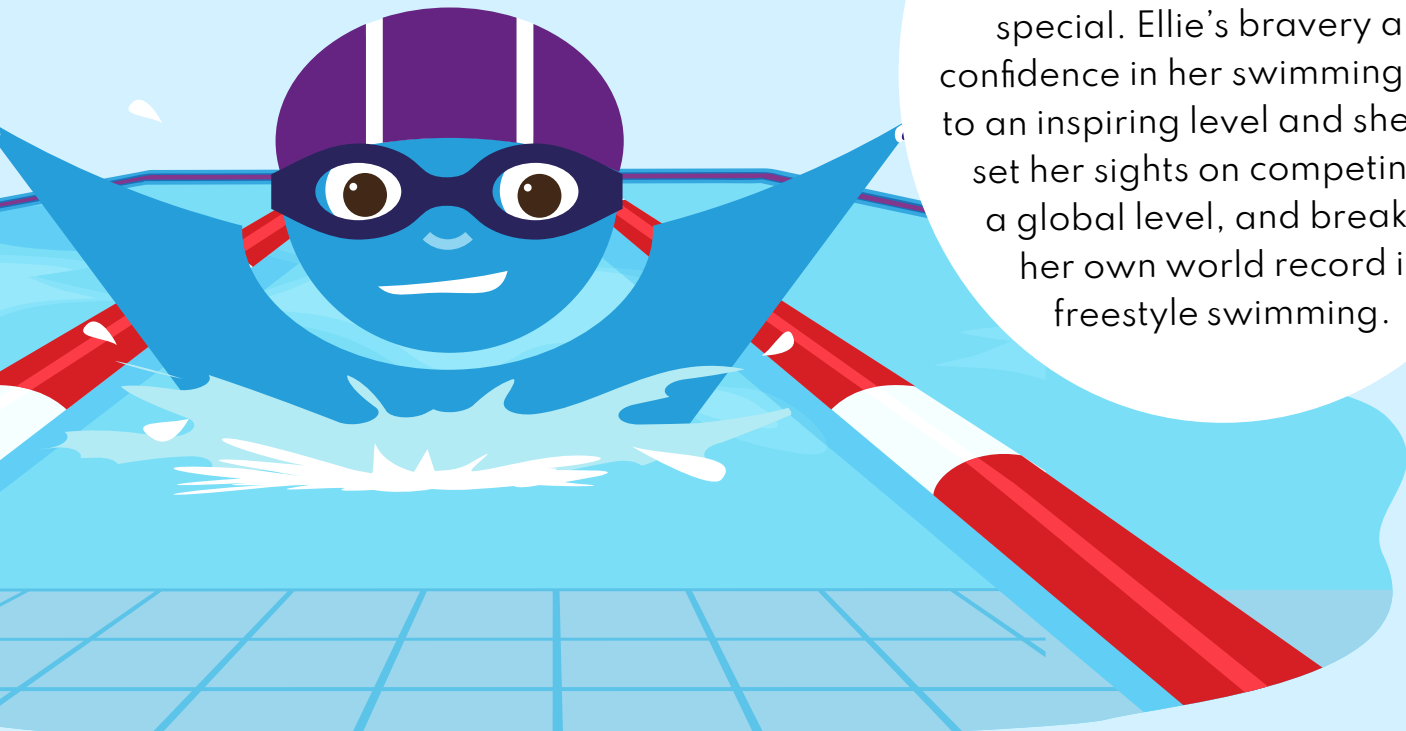
