We have immersed ourselves into various art activities from painting, drawing, acting, playing musical instruments and mosaicking. What a fantastic week!

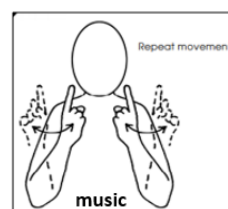
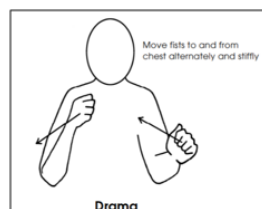
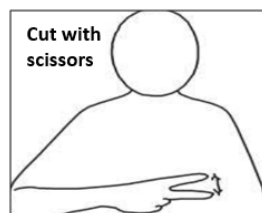

Class News

Year Group	What's Happening?
EYFS	<p>Another busy week in Reception. This week was Art Week, we have had lots of fun with paint, junk modelling and taking part in mosaic with the whole school. The children have loved exploring all mediums and using their imaginations. In Literacy we finished our beautiful book 'The Umbrella' and learnt about writing postcards. We were pretending to be the little dog that went on all the exciting adventures. In maths we explored subtraction and used number blocks to calculate our calculations! In addition to last weeks 'Health Week', please remember healthy food in our snack boxes! Have a wonderful and sunny weekend.</p>
Year 1	<p>This week in English, we sequenced pictures from "The boy with flowers in his hair". Then using our wonderful time words, we wrote what happened in each part of the story. In Maths we used our knowledge of tens and ones to compare numbers from 50 to 100.</p> <p>For art week, we helped create a mosaic. Each class also used printing with different materials to create an art piece together.</p> <p>We have also had a lot of fun at forest school this week where we went on a treasure hunt then used rope, tarpaulin and sticks to stop the pirate from getting the treasure!</p> <div style="display: flex; justify-content: space-around;">   </div>



Year 2

This week in Year 2 to commemorate Art Week, the children created some beautiful A3 canvases exploring the theme of nature. Darwin class produced a blossom themed canvas and Hawking class did fish. The children enjoyed working together to complete these. The children also attended art workshop where they all helped make a mosaic design for a TPA display.

In science this week, we observed the changes of our planted sunflower seeds. We considered if and how our sunflower seeds had changed. We reminded ourselves what germination means, which is when a seed starts to grow and produce shoots. We considered and discussed what conditions are best for germination. We drew and labelled a picture showing the best conditions for a seed

to germinate. We considered what we needed to do make sure our

seeds continue to grow.



Year 3

Through a very hot and sticky week, Year 3 have continued to work hard all with a smile on their faces. We have enjoyed celebrating Art Week this week and have taken part in a variety of activities, including self-portrait drawings and symmetry work. We have also been working collaboratively as a year group to create a canvas painting inspired by South America, which was displayed in our 'art gallery' by the end of the week. We are so proud of the children's enthusiasm this week!

Aside from our art activities, it has been 'business as usual' across our core curriculum. In maths this week, the children have continued to focus on time, looking closely at durations of time, comparing time, and problem solving. Please continue to support your child's understanding of time at home. You could do this by reading an analogue clock at different times throughout the day and linking to what we might be doing at this time- it is always good to have an understanding of the concept of time and how long things take.

In English this week, we have been learning to write poetry. We have looked closely at metaphors and how these can add depth to our writing, creating a vivid image for the reader. We have also been creating a bank of rhyming words to use in our poems.

<p>Year 4</p>	<p>A massive well done to Year 4 for another fantastic week of learning! This week, as part of Art Week, the children took part in a wonderful mosaic workshop which they thoroughly enjoyed. We also created two canvas paintings in the style of North American artist 'Saif Azzuz' – the children thoughtfully considered what they want our world to be like and through these works, showed a world with bees and a world without.</p> <p>In English this week, we started off the week by creating a story board to recap the main events in our class text, Shackleton's Journey. Following this, we recapped the key features and typical language found in a newspaper report. The children completed box-it-up plans and wrote incredible newspaper reports - applying all they had learnt over the last few weeks – to give an account of the moment Shackleton and his team hit an ice-burg.</p> <p>In maths this week, we continued with our 'Statistics' topic. At the start of the week, the children were introduced to line graphs in the context of time. They used their knowledge of scales to read a time graph accurately and create their own graphs to represent continuous data. Following on from this, they used addition and subtraction to answer questions accurately and ask their own questions about the data in line graphs. The children also represented the data we gathered from our statistical walk on Monday in a pictograph and bar chart – applying their learning from last week's maths lessons.</p> <p>In topic this week, we identified and researched the main landmarks in Richmond as part of our topic: Location, Location. We considered what a 'landmark' is and the children then worked in groups to create an information poster about the following local landmarks: Twickenham rugby stadium, Kew Gardens, Teddington Lock, Hampton Court Palace, Marble Hill House and Bushy Park. They worked collaboratively to share their ideas and prior knowledge.</p>
<p>Year 5</p>	<p>In Year 5 Maths this week we learnt about plotting and locating coordinates on a grid, using mantras to remember the order of the coordinates. "X is across, Y to the sky." In English we have been working on our creative skills and have been writing our own fictional stories. The children enjoyed planning their stories and designing their book covers. In science, we looked at the different stages of pregnancy and worked in partners to create flash cards. We thoroughly enjoyed our drama and music lessons as a part of art week. We played some games and created our very own "thunderstorm" using the instruments. We looked at using our</p>
