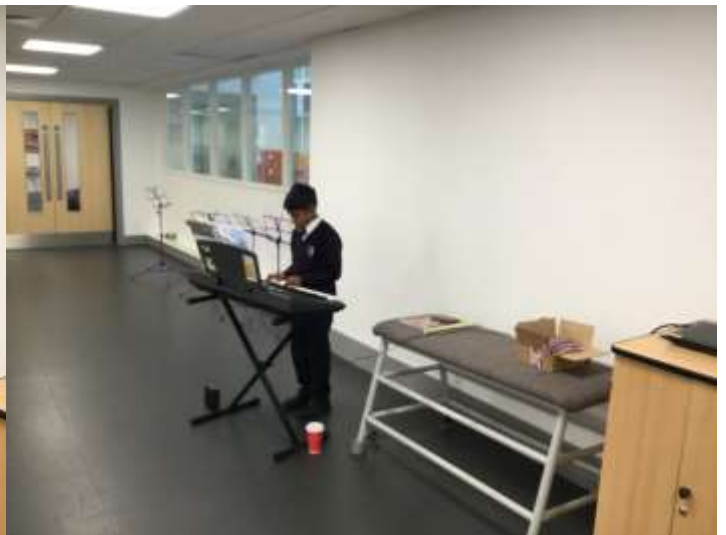


## Glennie Class: Week 11

This week we went on our second school trip and it was a really unique experience for the children. The children listened and watched with great awe when the Philharmonia Orchestra played different pieces based on bravery and courage. We learned about the composers, the background story of each piece of music played as well as how the different instruments and sounds portray the feelings and/or characters within the piece. The children even got a chance to be actively involved in one of the pieces using their voices and rhythm – they did really well with limited practise time. A big thank you to my lovely parent helpers who joined us on this trip!

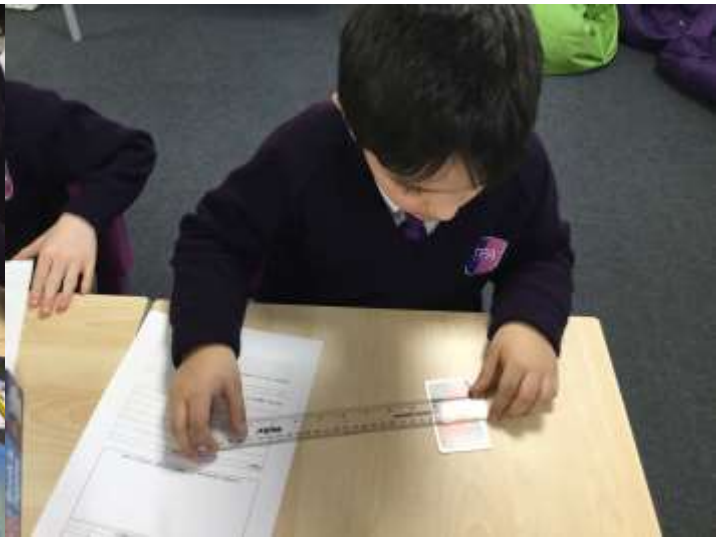


On Monday the recorder and piano students showed off their impressive skills in assembly. What a treat for us to hear them play and sing with such enthusiasm and confidence. Well done and a huge thank you to all of them and Mr William!



In English we have been exploring poetry by looking at the different devices used and analysing the purpose, context and intended audience. The children used their creativity and understanding of poetry when writing alliterated poems and enjoyed the use of onomatopoeia. We will continue with poetry next week and ask children to find and bring a poem they enjoy to share with their peers.

Maths has been very practical this week when we were learning all about measurement. The children have been using the ruler to measure the length of objects and worked hard to convert the measurement units using their multiplication and division skills.



In Topic we used computers and atlases to research the human and physical geography of different European countries. The children worked well with their partner and were able to answer the relevant questions.

Our Science lesson was about Magnetism. We learned that not all metals are magnetic and used Venn and Carroll diagrams to show the results of our comparative tests.



Today we enjoyed investigating and identifying the human geography of Spain and how different areas contribute to local ingredients for tapas dishes. The children used different cooking techniques to prepare and cook a Spanish tapas dish "Patatas bravas".



Throughout the week we continued to practise for our Christmas concert and this afternoon we made the props for the different songs and poems. The children are very confident when reciting their parts and sing with great enthusiasm.

#### **STAR WORK:**

This week Lilly and Lorenzo received the star certificates. Lilly showed great understanding of alliteration and onomatopoeia, and Lorenzo showed great confidence when reciting his line during our Christmas concert practise.

#### **WEEK 12:**

ENGLISH – We will continue to focus on poetry.

MATHS – We will continue to learn about measurement.

TOPIC – We will be learning about major capital cities of Europe.
