Class: Hepworth Week 3

Dear parents,

In Literacy we continued with letter and sound recognition and formation. Children have shown good awareness of initial sounds in words. We have been working more on blending CVC words with the covered sounds *s, a, t, p, i, n, m and d* and children are able to work out the words, sometimes with support. We have been working really hard on our pencil grips.

In Maths the children took part in a range of 2D and 3D shape activities, such as a shape hunt, shape sorting and making a shape picture. We also played "Guess the shape" game learning more about the properties of the different 2D and 3D shapes.

The children have had a lot of fun during PE, playing spatial awareness games and showing good control of movement through balancing beanbags and hoops on their heads.

WEEK 4:

LITERACY - We will introduce letter sounds c,k,g,o and look at key words such as cat, dog, kit, on and to

MATHS – We will be looking at One more/One less to 10 or 20; counting forward and backwards as well as counting on and back from a specific number

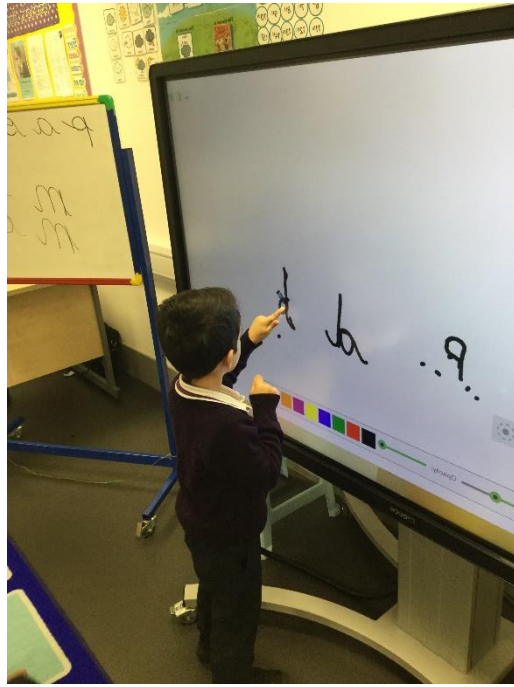
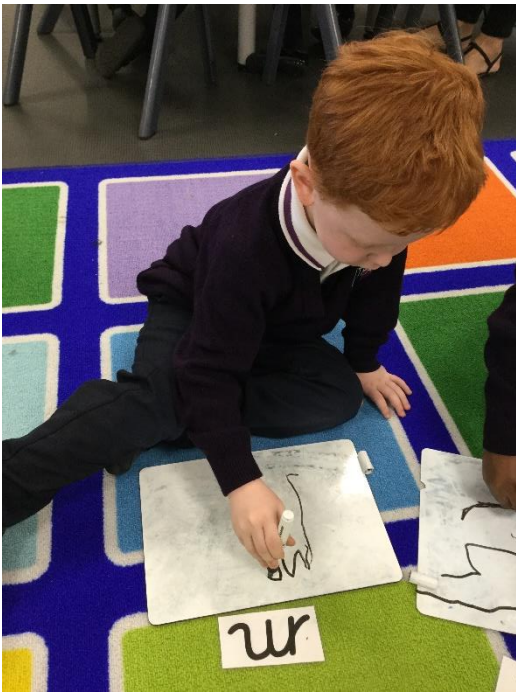
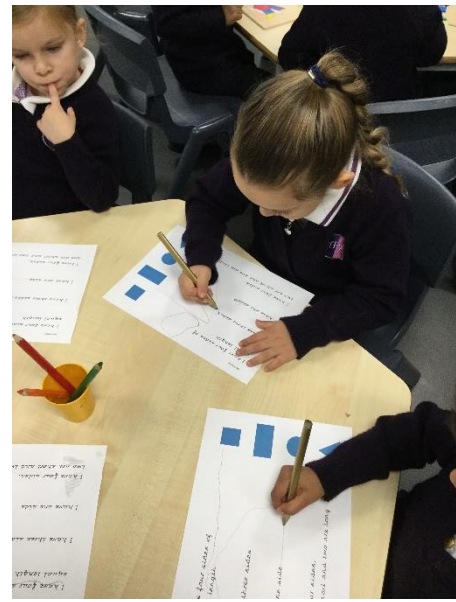
TOPIC – The next 2 weeks we will focus on Houses and Homes; talking about where we live and what our homes are like as well as looking at how homes changed over time.
